# **Guidelines for Authors**

### Submission types

We accept the following types of submissions:

#### **Individual talk**

Each individual talk is allocated 15 minutes, with an additional 5 minutes designated for questions and discussion. Talks will be organized around a common theme.

#### Abstracts should not exceed 2000 characters (including spaces).

#### Symposium

Symposia come in two forms – with or without a discussant – each lasting 100 minutes. A symposium without a designated discussant consists of five talks grouped thematically (15 minutes each, plus an additional 5 minutes for questions/discussion).

The second type of symposium involves grouping five 15-minute talks (with 5 minutes of question/discussion time), with the remaining time granted to the discussant.

Regardless of the chosen form, the symposium should be submitted by its organizer, who is also responsible for nominating the discussant and providing the title and abstract of the entire symposium. Organizers are additionally responsible for supplying titles and abstracts for individual talks.

Symposium overviews should not exceed 2000 characters (including spaces), and individual abstracts should be limited to 2000 characters (including spaces).

#### **BLITZ presentation**

A BLITZ presentation is a brief, 5-minute presentation consisting of 5 slides. They are primarily used for presenting the results of single, preliminary, and pilot studies.

BLITZ presentations will also be grouped thematically, with time allotted for questions or discussion at the end of each session.

Abstracts should not exceed 2000 characters (including spaces).





## Poster

A poster provides a visual summary of your work. <u>Please prepare your poster in</u> portrait orientation and in B1 format (70,7 x 100 cm).

As the poster's author, you will have the opportunity to discuss the research objectives, methods, and results directly with the public during a poster walk session.

Abstracts should be no longer than 2000 characters, including spaces.
