We are drawn to beauty automatically. Prof. Chatterjee will discuss how this automatic attraction, of which we are often unaware, has social consequences when aesthetic and moral values are conflated.

[Professor Anjan Chatterjee](#) is a Professor of Neurology, Psychology, and Architecture and the founding Director of the Penn Center for Neuroaesthetics. He wrote *The Aesthetic Brain: How We Evolved to Desire Beauty and Enjoy Art* and co-edited *Neuroethics in Practice: Mind, Medicine, and Society* and *The Roots of Cognitive Neuroscience: Behavioral Neurology and Neuropsychology*. He has received the Norman Geschwind Prize in Behavioral and Cognitive Neurology and the Rudolph Arnheim Prize for contribution to Psychology and the Arts. He is a founding member of the Board of Governors of the Neuroethics Society, the past President of the International Association of Empirical Aesthetics, and the past President of the Behavioral and Cognitive Neurology Society. He currently serves on the Boards of The College of Physicians of Philadelphia and has served on the boards of Haverford College, the Norris Square Neighborhood Project and the Associated Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired.

Neuroaesthetics is a relatively new discipline that investigates the biology of aesthetic experiences. I will review its conceptual underpinnings in light of two core questions. What is the nature of aesthetic experiences? Why do aesthetics matter? These questions will be organized around our engagement with art and architecture. I will address the applications of a taxonomy that we developed to characterize the impact of art, and psychological dimensions that we identified for our response to the built environment. In both instances, I will propose specific ways that art and architecture can be deployed to contribute to human wellbeing.
